COMPARISONS GOING GLOBAL?

With this conference we bring together researchers from different disciplines studying different regions of the world to answer the question of whether practices of comparing were different around the globe before the European Expansion and the consequent overpowering of the respective colonized regions:

Did practices of comparing function according to different logics prior to sustained contact with European civilisation? Or, conversely, did they exhibit logics that point to universal or more widespread features of doing comparisons that were previously considered distinctly "Western" or "modern"?

With our invited guests we hope to be able to compare 'practices of comparing' on a global scale, and thus – different than usual – to be able to start from non-European practices of comparing.
